#### **Capstone Formats**

You can choose from several capstone options based on your interests and goals. Each offers a chance to explore a topic deeply, apply skills, and reflect on your experience.

### 1. Research Project

- Who it's for: Students who want to do original research and contribute new knowledge.
- Deliverables: Written thesis and a defense, symposium presentation, or submission for publication
- **Examples**: Studying renewable energy in emerging economies or analyzing gender in literature.

#### 2. Professional Internship

- Who it's for: Students seeking real-world experience in their field.
- **Deliverables**: Internship report, reflective journal, and a final presentation.
- **Examples**: Working on marketing strategies for a startup or assisting in public health programs.

#### 3. Creative or Applied Project

- Who it's for: Students interested in producing tangible work like a portfolio, design, or performance.
- **Deliverables**: Creative work and a 5-10 page reflective paper.
- **Examples**: Making a short documentary or designing an app.

#### 4. Service Learning/Community Engagement

- Who it's for: Students who want to work on projects that serve the community.
- **Deliverables**: Project documentation and a reflective paper.
- **Examples**: Leading a voter registration campaign or tutoring local students.

### 5. Business/Social Entrepreneurship

- Who it's for: Students interested in starting a business or addressing social issues.
- **Deliverables**: Business plan, reflective report, and a pitch presentation.
- **Examples**: Developing a sustainable fashion line or creating a nonprofit.

#### 6. Digital Media Project

- Who it's for: Students who want to create digital content (e.g., apps, podcasts).
- **Deliverables**: Finished digital project and a reflective paper.
- **Examples**: Creating a podcast or designing a mental health app.

#### 7. Cross-Disciplinary Collaboration

- Who it's for: Students who want to work with others from different academic fields.
- **Deliverables**: Group report, individual reflections, and a group presentation.
- **Examples**: Engineering and art students collaborating on a project.

#### **Capstone Timeline**

The capstone can be completed at any point during your undergraduate studies, but here's a typical timeline:

- Spring (Junior Year): Start exploring potential capstone experiences
- **Fall (Senior Year)**: Submit your proposal and start working with a faculty mentor or professional supervisor.
- **Spring (Senior Year)**: Complete the project and present it at a public event (e.g., Honors Symposium).

#### Deliverables

For your capstone, you'll need to submit:

- A project proposal (goals, timeline).
- Regular meetings with your mentor to track progress.
- Format-specific deliverables like a thesis, report, portfolio, or creative work.
- A final presentation of your project.
